Dear MSD Families:

Oregon had submitted a waiver to the US Department of Education to release the requirement for state assessments this year. The waiver was not approved, but Oregon has adapted and **significantly reduced the number of tests and length of each test** for each grade level this year.

We are preparing for this year’s required state testing. This spring, students in grades 3 through 8, and 11 will take various Smarter Balanced English Language Arts (ELA) and Math and Oregon Science assessments. Grade specific details are included in the table below. We will be testing during May, and plan to be wrapped up by early June.

Included with this letter is the annual notice from the Oregon Department of Education regarding state testing.

Opting Out:

- If you wish to opt your student(s) out of ELA and Math testing, complete the attached form (1 form per student). Additional copies are available in the office. Completed forms need to be turned in to the office.
 - While the state opt out form encourages families to opt out prior to April 6, you may submit the form at any time.
- To opt your student out of the Science test, please contact your student’s Science teacher.

Additional Assessments:

This year, each grade level will take some, but not all, of the 3 academic assessments that are typically given at various grade levels. If you wish for your student to take the additional assessment opportunity listed in the table, please contact Mr. Hoffman directly.

ALL STUDENTS GRADUATE PREPARED

In 2010, Oregon adopted higher K-12 standards in English language arts and mathematics to ensure that all students move from grade to grade with the academic knowledge and skills necessary for success beyond high school. We have adjusted the test blueprint for 2020-21 to allow for reliable estimation of student performance, while decreasing the time that students spend testing. Please note that individual student reports will not be available for 2020-21.

How much time do the tests take?

The tests are not timed, so your child can take as long as they need to fully demonstrate what they know and can do. The ODE developed shortened blueprints for the 2020-21 school year, reducing testing times substantially. English Language Arts and Math assessments will take approximately one hour each. With our current exams, your child only tests once each year.

What do the results mean?

Summative test results identify systems-level strengths and areas for improvement in English language arts and mathematics for schools, districts, and the state. Individual student results will not be available for the 2020-21 school year.

Why does participation matter?

Your child's participation is important to help ensure that schools and districts receive the targeted resources they need to help all students succeed, particularly those from historically underserved backgrounds.

When will my child take the test?

Your child will be tested once. Your child's school will determine the specific dates your child takes the tests within the statewide testing window above.

- **Challenge students to think critically** and apply their knowledge to real-world problems
- **Use multiple item formats** to ensure multiple means of accessing item content

DESCRIPTION OF RIGHTS

House Bill 2655 permits parents and adult students* to annually opt-out of Oregon's statewide summative tests in English language arts and mathematics by submitting this form to the school the student attends. The school shall provide any student who is exempted from a state test with supervised study time while other students are testing.
